Paul's example

- 3. Read Philippians 1:12-18. What is the result of Paul's (the author's) imprisonment? Does this ever happen when we suffer today?
- 4. Read Philippians 1:19-26. Why does Paul decide it is better to remain alive and working than dead and with Christ?
- 5. Read Philippians 1:27-30. How should believers face trials? What good does that do?
- 6. Read Philippians 3:10-4:1. Why did Paul persevere and encourage other believers to persevere? What can you learn from this passage?

7. How is what Paul faced similar to what Joseph went through? How do these two examples compare with your life? (For more background on Paul's trials, read 2 Corinthians 11:23-29 & 12:9-11.)

Why do we persevere?

- 8. Read Romans 8:17-18. What connection do these verses make between suffering and glory? How is this message encouraging to you?
- 9. Read 1 Peter 4:12-16. What attitude does Peter say believers should have when we suffer? Why? Is this ever easy?
- 10. Read Hebrews 12:1-3. What are believers ordered to do? Does your life ever feel like a race? How can you fix your eyes on Jesus this week?
