## **EXAMPLES OF PRIDE**

Identify which of the "five tests for pride" the following figures failed (maybe more than one):

5. Read Genesis 37:1-11, 31-32—Joseph's brothers

Does jealousy ever *not* lead to pride? How can you surrender your position to God to overcome jealousy?

6.	Read 1 Samuel 13:7-14—Saul What was wrong with Saul's method of seeking advice? How have you tried to control your life? How can you surrender your own plans?

- 7. Read 1 Samuel 25:1-13—Nabal How was Nabal's reaction full of pride? How will serving those who can't repay you keep you from being prideful?
- 8. Read Esther 5:9-6:10—Haman Where did Haman's boasting lead him? How can you surrender your own praise?
- 9. Read Acts 5:1-11—Ananias and Sapphira What did this couple think they deserved? How could surrounding themselves by honest people have helped this couple? How can you do the same?
