- 6. Read Proverbs 23:4-5. What is this proverb trying to say about riches? What is Proverbs 11:28 trying to say?

- 8. Read Ephesians 1:17-18. What are the riches of God's glorious inheritance?
- 9. Read Matthew 6:19-21, 31-33. What is the value in seeking God's kingdom? How do we store up treasures in heaven?
- 10. Read Colossians 3:1-3. What does it mean to set our minds and hearts on things above?
- 11. Read Matthew 13:45-46. Do you ever value knowledge off the Lord and His Word and His kingdom as much as the people in these short parables? How do you show your enthusiasm?
- 12. How does studying these verses change the way you see your earthly wealth? How does studying these verses change the way you see your heavenly wealth? What can you do this week to value God's treasures over earthly treasures?
