- 9. Repentance is a turning from the old, to a new way of living. In what ways have you experienced repentance as you came

to follow Jesus?

- 10. Are there old patterns, habits or ways or thinking you need to continue to renounce or repent from?
- 11. How can you better walk with Christ today?
