Small Group Questions | Week of August 7, 2016

- 1. From last week's message, what do you think is the difference between "playing religion" and faithfully following God?
- 2. Would you take the time to try to tell difficult or even hostile people about your faith in God?
- 3. What are some ways you can find common ground and build bridges with people, in considering sharing your faith in God at some point?
- 4. Read 1 Cor. 9:19-23. What are some examples how these verses would apply in your life today?
- 5. Paul tells the story about how his encounter with Christ changed his life.
 - a. How might a personal testimony be effective in ways that a sermon would not?
 - b. How has your faith in Jesus redirected your life?
 - c. What is one of the hardest things you have had to experience because of your faith?
- 6. How is it easier to avoid embarrassment and risk being uncomfortable, by not talking about what we believe and about our faith in Jesus Christ?
- The violent crowd and potential Roman flogging made for a very stressful situation, yet Paul used this time to give his testimony. What does Paul tell us to do to be prepared for this opportunity? Read 2 Timothy 4:1-2.
- 8. Have you ever thought about your personal testimony?
 - a. What would you say (in three minutes or less) to someone who asked why you were a Christian?
- 9. Paul's citizenship became an asset in his efforts to share the Gospel with the Gentiles. What traits or experiences do you have which might help you share the Gospel with a particular group of people?
