- 1. Have you ever been torn between two decisions? What happened?
- 2. Have you ever wrestled with two conflicting desires (good and bad) at the same time? Explain.
- 3. In each case, what did you use to make your choice?
- 4. What stuck out to you from the sermon and James 4 this week?

Of Two Minds

- 5. Compare James 4:1 and Romans 7:14-25. What are the conflicting desires within a believer?
- 6. Compare James 4:1-12 and Galatians 5:16-18. What can a believer do when struggling with sin? What other verses support these strategies?
- 7. How similar are the messages from James and Paul (author of Galatians and Romans)?

Tearing Down and Building Up

8. What does Galatians 5:13-14 command? Who is Paul talking to? What is the warning in verse 15? How have you seen believers tear each other apart? What can we do?

- 9. Read Romans 13:8-14. What is the purpose of loving our neighbor?
- 10. How can we love our neighbor?
- 11. What does love have to do with James 4, the sermon, and our conflicting desires? How does the study this week influence you?
- 12. Is it possible for a believer to resist the desire of their sinful nature? Is the believer actually in control, or are our warring desires in control? (Consider the above verses plus Colossians 3:5-10 and 1 John 3:4-9 and 1 Corinthians 10:13 and Romans 6 and Ephesians 2:1-5.)
