DISCUSSION

- 2. What is a difference between debating theology and standing up against false doctrine?
- 3. Consider this quote. What does it mean? Is it true? How often do you think people equate sharing the Gospel to winning an argument? Why?

- 5. Read Colossians 2:1-15. If all you knew about salvation came from these verses, what would you know?
- 6. How can you use these verses to spot true teachings versus false ones?

- 7. Read Proverbs 8:17. What does this have to with false teachings? How can believers keep from being caught by lies?
- 8. Read 1 Thessalonians 5:20-21. What does it mean to "test" the prophecies? How does that relate to false teachings?
- 9. According to Hebrews 5:14, how can we be ready for the "solid food" of mature truths of God's Word?
- 10. Read Galatians 1:8 (above). Does this seem overly harsh? Why or why not?
- 11. If you speak out against false teachings, how can you keep from getting caught in the need to be right? How can you hold to God's Word and truth without relying on your opinion?
