•	Samson Fighting first and asking questions later. Judges 14:5-7, 16:20-22, 28-30
•	Jonah Hiding the one who almost got away. Jonah 1:1-3, 17, 2:10
•	Peter Jumping in feet first and then getting cold feet. Matthew 14:28-31
