8. Read Colossians 4:5-6. If all you knew about interacting with strangers came from these verses, what would you know?

- 9. Compare these verses to John 1:14, which is about Jesus (the Word).
- 10. Why does 1 Peter 4:11 tell us to speak/serve like God?

Believers

- 11. Read Colossians 4:7-18. If all you knew about interacting with fellow believers came from these verses, what would you know?
- 12. Why does John 13:34-35 say to love each other?
- 13. Finally, read 1 John 2:6. Why is it important to know how to pray, speak, and love like Jesus?
- 14. What does imitating Jesus have to do with wisdom? Does imitating Jesus have anything to do with the fear of the Lord (Proverbs 9:10)?
- 15. This week, how can you use the verses from this study to act with wisdom?
