## 11/13 | REVELATION: Pain

"After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could count, from **every nation and all tribes and peoples and tongues**, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, and palm branches were in their hands."

-Revelation 7:9 | NASB (emphasis added)

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Revelation is filled with examples of creatures and angels and people worshiping the LORD (Revelation 4:10, 15:4, etc.). As a group, come up with a definition of worship.
- 2. How does worship help us encounter the trials of life?
- 3. The sermon presented counsel for surviving, dealing with pain, and moving forward. One of them was, "Find your community."
  Why do you think community is so important to the believer?
- 4. Consider the quote on the right. In what ways does the local church help us "bear one another's burdens"?

"The church is not meant to be a loosely bound association of functional Lone Rangers. Paul confronts that type of thinking when he writes, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2).

5. Read Hebrews 10:25 and 1

Corinthians 12:14-21. What

advantages of community do you read in these verses?

6. Another counsel was **"Find your purpose in suffering."** In 1 Peter 4:12-16, Christians are told to rejoice in suffering. Why?

Read Romans 8:18. In light of Revelation 7, what does glory have to do with suffering?

Suffering produces hope (Romans 5:3,4). This is the hope of righteousness (Galatians 5:5), and hope of glory (Colossians 1:27), and hope of eternal life (Titus 1:2). How does such hope help you deal with pain to survive today?

7. Another counsel was to "Look at the lamb" (paraphrased).

Describe a time when you clearly saw God. Where were you? What were you doing? What helped you see him?

What trials and pain are you facing? How would a clear view of God on His throne help comfort you in those afflictions?

What things help you remember that God is still on His throne?

How does a vision of heaven help you through trials here on earth?
