- 8. What messages of comfort are in the final chapters of Revelation?

10. Paraphrase the description of judgment given in Revelation 20:11- 15. Compare this to Matthew 25:31-46. What role do our good deeds play in our judgment?

12. From 1 Corinthians 15:35-53; Philippians 3:21 and Revelation 21:4, what might our new bodies be like?

14. List the "sweet" things that will be in heaven. What is the sweetest of them all?
15. How does it make you feel that God desperately awaits your presence in heaven?
