Discussion Questions.

2. Look at 1 Samuel 16:7. How does this verse contrast God’s vision with ours? What would it look like to see people or situations through God’s eyes?
3. Hebrews 11:6 says it’s impossible to please God without faith. Why do you think faith matters so much to God? What kind of faith do you think He’s calling you to have right now?
4. Where in your life do you feel like you’re hitting a wall right now? How might God be inviting you to believe there’s still a way?
5. Has there been a time when God gave you eyes to see something others missed? What happened?
6. What fears keep you from taking faith-filled risks?
7. What is one specific action you sense God calling you to take in faith this week? (Start something? Forgive someone? Surrender control?)
8. How can this group encourage or support you in taking that next step?

9. Who in your life needs someone to believe in them right now? What’s one way you can encourage or invest in that person this week?
