Main Idea. The Church is not just a building or event. The Church is a family on mission. We gather to love, unite, and encourage one another as a living expression of Jesus.

Icebreaker. What's one thing that's helped you feel "at home" in a church community?

Scripture Reading. John 13:34-35; John 17:20-21; Hebrews 10:24-25; Acts 28:15, Romans 15:5-6.

Discussion Questions.

- 1. In John 13, Jesus says "love for one another" is the primary mark of discipleship. Looking at this verse, what does "as I have loved you" mean in practical terms?
- 2. How does 1 Peter 4:8's call to "love deeply" challenge the way we sometimes approach church relationships?
- 3. Think about Dorcas in Acts 9. How does her story help us see "love in action" without needing a platform or public recognition?
- 4. According to Jesus's prayer in John 17, how is unity connected to the world believing in Him?
- 5. Romans 15:5-6 describes unity as an act of worship. How does that change the way you think about gathering with others who are different from you?
- 6. The Nehemiah 3 story shows many types of people building together. If our church were like that wall-building team, what role would you want to play?
- 7. Hebrews 10 challenges us not to give up meeting together. In light of that, what are some subtle ways the enemy might try to isolate us from community?

- 8. In Acts 28:15, Paul was encouraged simply by people showing up. Who has "shown up" for you in a way that strengthened your faith?
- 9. How can we gently help others see the value in consistent community?

Next Steps.

- Recommit to gathering regularly—even when it's hard.
- Identify one person you could encourage or invite this week.
- Pray together for "ONEs"—people close to you but far from God.

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
